

# Mescalero, NM - Mescalero Reformed Church



For the fourth time, students have the opportunity to travel to Mescalero, New Mexico to partner with the Mescalero Reformed Church on the Apache reservation. Students will have the opportunity to serve alongside former NWC professor Mark Vellinga and native leaders as they seek to maintain the communities' Native American heritage while following and serving Jesus.

## Waco, TX - Mission Waco

Mission Waco was founded in 1992 in North Waco. Mission Waco's program are built around three goals: 1) empowerment through relationship-based, holistic programs among the poor and marginalized, 2) mobilizing middle-class Christians toward "hands-on" involvement, and 3) addressing systemic issues which disempower the poor. As volunteers, interns, and donations increased, and as local gaps were identified, additional programs were added to the original children and teen programs. Today they have over 30 ministries operating under the Mission Waco umbrella. Our team will participate in manual labor projects in the mornings and will facilitate a street camp (think VBS) in the afternoons. We will also have the privilege to worship at a church for the homeless known as the Church Under the Bridge (CUB), which began under the Interstate 35 bridge.

In the past, students have painted a mural at a school, volunteered at an afterschool program, and helped at a food pantry and served a meal at the Salvation Army.
