

# Hall Discipleship

## Coordinator

### Responsibilities:

**Serve in his/her living area as the Hall Discipleship Coordinator.**

- One coordinator is selected for each residence hall and one for the apts, plexes and commuters.

**Oversee the management of the Discipleship Group (D-Group) program in his/her area.**

- Publicize opportunities.
- Organize structures (in cooperation with Campus Ministry and Residence Life).
- Assist in development of curriculum for D-Groups.

**Assist in recruitment, selection, and equipping of Discipleship Group Leaders (DGLs).**

- Assure that there are a sufficient number and quality of DGLs for his/her living area.
- Assist in planning for and the training of DGLs.

**Serve as a shepherd to the DGLs in his/her living area.**

- Have a positive commitment to meeting regularly (weekly) with DGLs for prayer, encouragement, and equipping.
- Pray regularly for leaders and groups.
- Provide appropriate resources for DGLs.

**Coordinate programs that encourage Christian spiritual formation in his/her living area.**

- Determine appropriate hall programs that encourage Christian growth to various hall residents (e.g. all hall worship, prayer gatherings, 1-1 mentoring, etc.)
- In addition to D-groups, promote other campus Christian growth and ministry opportunities to the hall residents
- Cooperate and coordinate with residence life staff by assisting in hall programming as appropriate

**Receive training in small group dynamics, Bible study, pastoral care, management, etc.**

- Read and use resources.
- Discuss in meetings and gatherings.
- Attend training opportunities both on and off campus.

### Selection Process:

- Cumulative GPA of 2.0 (minimum) and in good academic standing

**Why Discipleship Ministry?** To facilitate Christian spiritual growth opportunities for students.

### Commitments:

**Commit to growing** in relationship with Christ.

**Encourage others** in their faith development.

**Engage** with other areas of ministry and campus.

**Actively learn** about issues of Christian leadership.

**Attend** all meetings and training opportunities, including the following:

- Spring Student Leadership event
- CMT Orientation beginning Sunday, August 17, 2014 (**CMT must coordinate summer responsibilities to be able to attend orientation. CMT cannot be a RA, on O-Staff or a Multicultural Intern due to schedule conflicts with CMT orientation. Fall varsity athletes and athletic trainers must coordinate their schedule to attend a suitable portion of CMT orientation.**)
- All meetings whose dates and times will be set later.

### Accountability and Wages:

- There is one Hall Discipleship Coordinator position for each residence hall and one position for the apartments/plexes and commuters.
- Coordinators are accountable to the Associate Dean of Spiritual Formation.
- Coordinators work closely with Campus Discipleship Coordinators and Discipleship Group Leaders.
- Approximately \$1255 stipend per year (5 - 7 hours of work/week expected).
- Student should not have major leadership or work responsibilities in addition to a CMT position.
- CMT students may not have another contracted campus job, however they may be employed as student tutors or with Sodexo.

### Expectations of NWC Student Leaders

Student leaders play an important role in the Northwestern community and contribute in significant ways towards accomplishing Northwestern's mission and Vision for Learning. Being selected to serve as a student leader is an honor—it recognizes a student's leadership gifts and potential. Northwestern staff members are committed to mentoring student leaders, helping them to grow in their positions and encouraging them to develop their leadership abilities.

Due to their public roles on campus, Northwestern expects student leaders to follow, support, and enforce the college's standards and guidelines with highest integrity. Northwestern staff will consider potential student leaders' stances on college policies when selecting student leaders. In cases where a current student leader either (a) fails to abide by a campus policy, or (b) actively opposes a campus policy and/or states that they will refuse to live by that policy in the future, consequences may include, but are not limited to, temporary or permanent suspension from their leadership position. Consequences will be determined by the student leader's staff supervisor in conjunction with the Dean of Students on a case-by-case basis.
