

Student Activities Coordinator Northwestern College 2014-2015

The main responsibility of an individual working in student activities is to help enhance the social atmosphere at Northwestern College through shared event experiences. This responsibility is accomplished through student led planning teams. The SAC Leader position can provide an individual with the opportunity to build new skills and sharpen leadership characteristics. One of the most rewarding skills the SAC Leader may develop is learning to help and serve others.

Prerequisites

The following minimum qualifications must be met by all individuals in the Students Activities program:

- 1. A commitment to grow in one's faith
- 2. Enrolled as a full time student
- 3. Good standing with the College
- 4. Have a cumulative G.P.A. of 2.50 and maintain a 2.50 while holding this position
- 5. Not holding any other work study position nor having more than 10 additional hours of co-curricular/work commitments

Responsibilities

- Assist the Director of Student Programs in planning and implementing significant and memorable campus wide activities for the student body
- Serve as the chair of a planning team Dance, Games & Competitions, Stage Events, Concerts & Entertainment
- Provide support as needed for events planned by other teams
- Actively recruit SAC members to volunteer and serve on a planning team
- Attend weekly SAC Leadership Meetings, and Planning Team Meetings
- Complete weekly assigned to do tasks as presented in the SAC Leadership Meetings
- Attend Bi-Weekly Leadership Development Meetings
- Be available to return to campus on Wednesday, August 20 for Fall Training
- Other duties and responsibilities as assigned

Expectations of Student Leaders

Student leaders play an important role in the Northwestern community and contribute in significant ways towards accomplishing Northwestern's mission and Vision for Learning. Being selected to serve as a student leader is an honor—it recognizes a student's leadership gifts and potential. Northwestern staff members are committed to mentoring student leaders, helping them to grow in their positions and encouraging them to develop their leadership abilities.

Because of their public roles on campus, Northwestern expects student leaders to follow, support, and enforce the college's standards and guidelines with highest integrity. Northwestern staff will consider potential student leaders' stances on college policies when selecting student leaders. In cases where a current student leader either (a) fails to abide by a campus policy, or (b) actively opposes a campus policy and/or states that they will refuse to live by that policy in the future, consequences may include, but are not limited to, temporary or permanent suspension from their leadership position. Consequences will be determined by the student leader's staff supervisor in conjunction with the Dean of Students on a case-by-case basis.

Remuneration

SAC Leaders work approximately 8 hours/week and are compensated with a yearly stipend distributed in 4 payment increments/semester.
