Valuing diverse people, cultures and ideas is a critical part of the education that we offer at Northwestern. Each year, Intercultural Interns are selected to help NWC students make that goal a reality. They meet weekly as a team to discuss how to improve the intercultural atmosphere on-campus, serve in the Intercultural Development Office for 2-3 office hours each week, and they identify individual projects to work on through the year that will make a difference at NWC, mentored by an Intercultural staff member. Each intern receives a stipend for their involvement with the program.

- 2-4 student positions living in student housing and serving as representatives of the Intercultural Development Office to the campus community
- Work closely with I-Club, La Mosaic, or other Intercultural Development Office programs, mentored by Intercultural staff member
- Coordinate activities, educational opportunities, campus awareness; advocate for underrepresented students, and campus diversity.
- Contribute to a pro-active diversity dream team.
- Five hours/week, including 2-3 hours each week in Intercultural Office
- Receive \$1,250 stipend for the school year

- Cross-cultural and/or multicultural experience (or very strong interest)
- Passion for campus diversity and for service to students
- Eager to learn, teachable
- Self-management, organizational, and interpersonal communication skills
