### <u>Summary</u>

This scholarship was established by Betty (Herzog) and John Kendall as an encouragement to students in the baccalaureate nursing program at Northwestern College. Recipients must be full-time sophomores, juniors, or seniors who demonstrate financial need. The scholarship is renewable for sophomore or junior recipients.

#### <u>Requirements</u>

- Full-time sophomore, junior or senior student in good standing
- Recipients will be students enrolled in the baccalaureate nursing program
- Recipients must demonstrate financial need
- Renewable for sophomore or junior recipients

### Description and Basis for Award

- 1. Applicants must be full-time students.
- 2. The initial awards (2) will be granted for the 2017-2018 academic year.
- 3. Recipients shall be students enrolled in the baccalaureate nursing program and in good standing with all of the program's requirements.
- 4. Recipients shall be sophomores, juniors, or seniors. Preference for the initial awards shall be given to sophomore students.
- 5. The scholarship is renewable for sophomore and junior recipients.
- 6. Students must demonstrate financial need.
- 7. Selection of recipients shall be made by the nursing department faculty with input from the Financial Aid office. An essay will be required. An essay is required. Topic: *Describe what it means to be a Christian leader in the nursing profession*.

#### Accountability to Donor

Each year, the advancement office will inform the Kendalls as to the current year scholarship recipients. Those receiving the scholarships will be encouraged to write a brief note of introduction and appreciation to the Kendalls. Both the recipients and the donors will be invited to the annual Scholarship Day Luncheon held on campus each fall.
